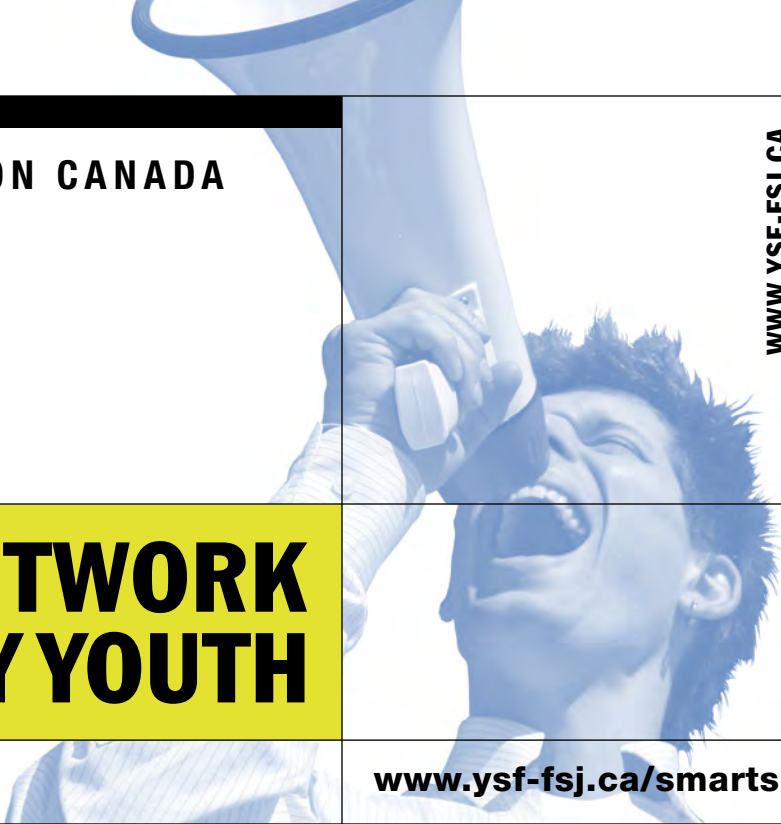

SMARTS is Youth Science Foundation Canada's for-youth, by-youth network that connects young Canadians with science – and one another. Founded by then-16-year-old Joshua Liu, SMARTS promotes science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) to students in grades seven and up.

Run by a national network of student volunteers, SMARTS helps young Canadians get excited about and involved in science, whether through getting into a particular program or competing – and winning – at science fairs.



THE SMARTS NETWORK

SMARTS Forums let youth with a passion for science be part of a virtual community: to share ideas, debate and collaborate. The forums encourage diverse, creative thinking; provoke questions and insight into science and its issues; and let young Canadians – wherever they live – connect with one another.

Regional Correspondents lead the youth science movement in their communities. They are the eyes and ears of the local science scene. They find new programs, competitions and events, and make sure School Correspondents know all about them. They do everything from helping local schools get involved in science fairs to representing SMARTS at local science events.

School Correspondents not only help kids in their school get started on a science project, they make sure the school stays in the loop. They receive monthly SMARTS updates on upcoming science, technology, engineering and mathematics programs, competitions and events so they can make sure their schools know all about them.

Have a question? Need help? SMARTS' **Ask an Expert** program, made up of alumni from the Canada-Wide Science Fair and Team Canada, offers subject-specific advice to students taking on a project. From life sciences to mathematics, they are there to answer questions, share experiences and show you the most effective ways to present your science.
